“His absolute independence to do as He pleases and His absolute control over the actions of all His creatures. No creature, person, or empire can either thwart His will or act outside the bounds of His will.” (Jerry Bridges)¹

The Sovereignty of God, the Decrees of God and the Providence of God²

- **Sovereign (God Reigns)**
- **God's Decrees (His Plans)**
 - His decrees refer to His Sovereign plan.
 - Eph. 3:7-13
 - “the decrees of God are, His eternal purpose, according to the counsel of His Will, whereby, for His own glory, he hath foreordained whatsoever comes to pass” (WSC, 7)
 - “The reason why any event occurs, or, that it passes from the possible into that of the actual, is that God has so decreed.” (Charles Hodge)

Question: If God intended something to happen, if a purpose of God did not come to be, what would that imply?

- **Providence (Execution of God's Sovereign Plans)**
 - “The working of God's Sovereignty to continually uphold, guide, and care for His creation.” – Paul Helm
 - Job 12:10; Psalm 104:10-27; Rom. 8:28
 - Q. What do you understand by the providence of God?
A. The almighty and ever present power of God by which God upholds, as with his hand, heaven and earth and all creatures, and so rules them that leaf and blade, rain and drought, fruitful and lean years, food and drink, health and sickness, prosperity and poverty-all things, in fact, come to us not by chance but by His Fatherly hand. (Question 27, Heidelberg Catechism)
